

MINUTES
Lefors City Council Meeting
March 10, 2025 - Regular Session

Mayor Michael Ray called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Present were Council members Ashley Miller, James Gee, Savannah Kingcade, Jerry Stegall, and Aaron Hunt.

Mayor Ray led the Pledge of Allegiance. Councilman Gee said the Invocation.

No public comments were made.

In his written report Judge Kurt Curfman reported for the month of February 2025, the city had receipts of \$-0-. There were no new complaints or citations filed with the court. Currently, there is an outstanding balance of fines and court costs due the city of \$200.00, plus warrants of \$10,154.00. The city is current with all local, state, and federal reports.

Public Works Director Chad Young reported to Council that the water tower, which has been offline for several years, has been leaking. They have the valve dug up at the water tower and water is leaking by. The tower is going to have to be drained and to do that, the town will have to be shut down while the line going to the water tower is plugged. This will be done later in the year. The water leaking by accounts for a lot of the monthly water loss. Young also reported that the sewer plant construction is complete, and the plant is up and running. The last lab reports came back within permit levels. West Texas Utilities is finishing the water line replacement from grant funds on First Street. A 6" main that 150' long is being replaced as well as a fire hydrant. They are currently waiting on parts, as the 6" main ties into a 2" main. Also, the roof on the concession stand in the baseball park is being replaced and the stand will be ready to use this summer.

Councilwoman Kingcade made a motion to approve the consent agenda including minutes of the February 10, 2025, regular meeting, bills, and department reports. Councilwoman Miller seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Non-Action Items: Mayor Ray signed a Proclamation proclaiming April 2025 as National Child Abuse Prevention Month in Lefors and urged all citizens to recognize this month by dedicating ourselves to the task of improving the quality of life for all children and families.

Councilman Hunt made a motion to approve audit as presented by Foster, Lambert & Foard, LLC. Councilwoman Kingcade seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Councilwoman Kingcade made a motion to accept certification by the City Secretary of unopposed candidates for the May 3, 2025, city general election elected to office and canceling the election. Councilman Gee seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Councilman Hunt made a motion to adopt a Resolution regarding a Contract for the purpose of financing "Personal Property Related to Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvements." Councilwoman Miller seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Councilwoman Kingcade made a motion to approve review of annual racial profiling report. Councilwoman Miller seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

No action taken regarding purchasing a generator from Guy Bennett.

No executive session was held.

Councilwoman Miller made a motion to adjourn. Councilwoman Kingcade seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.
